- 2 Turn this knob clockwise to increase or counter-clockwise to decrease the output volume.
- 3 Press this button and use the + or (10) buttons to set the keyboard octave range.

Note: 3 seconds of not pressing either of the + and - buttons will set the + and - buttons back to the Sound, Rhythm or Song content selection mode.

4 Press this button and use the + or - (10) buttons to set the keyboard transpose amount.

Note: 3 seconds of not pressing either of the + and - buttons will set the + and - buttons back to the Sound, Rhythm or Song content selection mode.

- 5 Press this button to turn the sound Sustain on or off.
- 6 ~ 8 Press any of these buttons to enter the labelled mode.
- Press this button to start or stop Metronome.
- 10 Press either of these buttons to select the next or previous Sound, Rhythm or Song content, depending on the current selected mode. Combined with other buttons, these buttons also changes various parameters.
- Press this button to start or stop the current selected Rhythm or Song.


